improvisers from across the country were given a pencil and a blank piece of paper and told to improvise a stick figure drawing this book is the collection of those drawings

the human touch is a book focused on the creative processes at work in british contemporary improvisational theatre and how these processes draw on the humanity of the participants their cognitive abilities their lives and their relationships to

each other vulnerability is a main feature of both the book and of improvisational theatre both part of the hurdles that improvisers face and a creative tool through a study of improvisation and vulnerability the book teaches us both what makes improvisational theatre so human and opens the door to a reflection about how to use humanity and human emotions in performance most importantly it delves into the cognitive and physiological processes at work in improvisation a topic which is missing from most manuals and studies offered to students this book is addressed to theatre students and provides both an important overview of the form s history and a challenge to what is usually taught about improvisation

game designers authors artists and scholars discuss how roles are played and how stories are created in role playing games board games computer games interactive fictions massively multiplayer games improvisational theater and other playable media games and other playable forms from interactive fictions to improvisational theater involve role playing and story something played and something told in second person game designers authors artists and scholars examine the different ways in which these two elements work together in tabletop role playing games rpgs computer games board games card games electronic literature political simulations locative media massively multiplayer games and other forms that invite and structure play second person so called because in these games and playable media it is you who plays the roles you for whom the story is being told first considers tabletop games ranging from dungeons dragons and other rpgs with an explicit social component to kim newman s choose your own adventure style novel life s lottery and its more traditional author reader interaction contributors then examine computer based playable structures that are designed for solo interaction for the singular you including the mainstream hit prince of persia the sands of time and the genre defining independent production façade finally contributors look at the intersection of the social spaces of play and the real world considering among other topics the virtual communities of such massively multiplayer online role playing games mmorpgs as world of warcraft and the political uses of digital gaming and role playing techniques as in the howard dean for iowa game the first u s presidential campaign game in engaging essays that range in tone from the informal to the technical these writers offer a variety of approaches for the examination of an emerging field that includes works as diverse as george r r martin s wild cards series and the classic infocom game planetfall appendixes contain three fully playable tabletop rpgs that demonstrate some of the variations possible in the form

in this two volume handbook contributors from across the globe provide expert perspectives on the assessment measurement and evaluation of student learning in music

this book constitutes the refereed proceedings of the third international conference on interactive digital storytelling icids 2010 held in edinburgh uk in november 2010 the book includes 3 keynotes 25 full and short papers 11 posters 4 demonstration papers 6 workshop papers and 1 tutorial the full and short papers have been organized into the following topical sections characters and decision making story evaluation and analysis story generation arts and humanities narrative theories and modelling systems and applications

expanding the space for improvisation pedagogy in music is a critical research based anthology exploring improvisation in music pedagogy the book broadens the understanding of the potentials and possibilities for improvisation in a variety of music education contexts and stimulates the development of knowledge and reflection on improvisation the book critically examines the challenges cultural values aims and methods involved in improvisation pedagogy written by international contributors representing a variety of musical genres and research methodologies it takes a transdisciplinary approach and outlines a way ahead for improvisation pedagogy and research by providing a space for the exchange of knowledge and critique this book will be of great interest to scholars researchers and postgraduate students in the fields of arts education music education improvisation music psychology musicology ethnomusicology artistic research and community music it will also appeal to music educators on all levels in the field of music education and music psychology

this open access two volume set Incs 10980 and 10981 constitutes the refereed proceedings of the 30th international conference on computer aided verification cav 2018 held in oxford uk in july 2018 the 52 full and 13 tool papers presented together with 3 invited papers and 2 tutorials were carefully reviewed and selected from 215 submissions the papers cover a wide range of topics and techniques from algorithmic and logical foundations of verification to practical applications in distributed networked cyber physical and autonomous systems they are organized in topical sections on model checking program analysis using polyhedra synthesis learning runtime verification hybrid and timed systems tools probabilistic systems static analysis theory and security sat smt and decisions procedures concurrency and cps hardware industrial applications

frank o hara s poetry evokes a specific era and location new york in the fifties and early sixties this is a pre computer age of typewritten manuscripts small shops and lunch hours it is also an age of gay repression accelerating consumerism and race riots hazel smith suggests that the location and dislocation of the cityscape creates hyperscapes in the poetry of frank o hara the hyperscape is a postmodern site characterized by difference breaking down unified concepts of text city subject and art and remolding them into new textual subjective and political spaces this book theorizes the process of disruption and re figuration which constitutes the hyperscape and celebrates its radicality

music is a tremendously powerful channel through which people develop their personal and social identities music is used to communicate emotions thoughts political statements social relationships and physical expressions but just as language can mediate the construction and negotiation of developing identities so music can also be a means of communication through which aspects of people s identities are constructed music can have a profound influence on our developing sense of identity our values and our beliefs be it from rock music classical music or jazz musical identities macdonald hargreaves and miell 2002 was unique in being in being one of the first books to explore this fascinating topic this new book documents the remarkable expansion and growth in the study of musical identities since the publication of the earlier work the editors identify three main features of current psychological approaches to musical identities which concern their definition development and the identification of individual differences as well as four main real life contexts in which musical identities have been investigated namely in music and musical institutions specific geographical communities education and in health and well being this conceptual framework provides the rationale for the structure of the handbook the book is divided into seven main sections the first sociological discursive and narrative approaches includes several general theoretical accounts of musical identities from this perspective as well as some more specific investigations the second and third main sections

deal in depth with two of the three psychological topics described above namely the development of and individual differences in musical identities the fourth fifth and sixth main sections pursue three of the real life contexts identified above namely musical institutions and practitioners education and health and well being the seventh and final main section of the handbook case studies includes chapters which look at particular musical identities in specific times places or contexts the multidisciplinary range and breadth of the handbook s contents reflect the rapid changes that are taking place in music in digital technology and in their role in society as a whole such that the study of musical identity is likely to proliferate even further in the future

keith johnstone entered the royal court theatre as a new playwright in 1956 a decade later he emerged as a groundbreaking director and teacher of improvisation his decisive book impro 1979 described johnstone s unique system of training weaving together theories and techniques to encourage spontaneous collaborative creation using the intuition and imagination of the actors johnstone has since become world renowned inspiring theatre greats and beginners alike and his work continues to influence practice within and beyond the traditional theatre theresa robbins dudeck is the first author to rigorously examine johnstone s life and career using a combination of archival documents many from johnstone s personal collection participant observation and interviews with johnstone his colleagues and former students keith johnstone a critical biography is a fascinating journey through the physical spaces that have served as johnstone s transformative classrooms and into the conceptual spaces which inform his radical pedagogy and approach to artistic work

the most comprehensive smart helpful and inspiring guide to improve available today applicable to comedians actors public speakers and anyone who needs to think on their toes from the improv handbook the problem for improvisers is anxiety faced with a lot of nameless eyes staring at us and feeling more than anything else like prey we are likely to want to display very consistent behavior so that anyone who looks at us looks away and then looks back sees the same thing thus we become boring we fade into the background and we cease to be of interest the improv handbook provides everything someone interested in improvisational comedy needs to know as written by a husband and wife comedy duo with years of experience and teaching in the field in addition to providing a comprehensive history of improvisational theater as a backdrop it also looks at modern theories and practices of improvisation on a global scale including how the form of

comedy has evolved differently in different parts of the world from europe to the uk to the chicago scene the improv handbook also contains an essential performance segment that details different formats of improvisation chapter topics include theatresports micetro gorilla theatre and the inventions of keith johnstone and del close as well as other popular forms of improv like those on whose line is it anyway the core section of the book is called simply how to improvise and delves into issues of spontaneity the fundamentals of storytelling working together upping the ante and character development the book concludes with sections on how to improvise in front of an audience and just as crucially how to attract an audience in the first place

part of a growing group of works that addresses the burgeoning field of sound studies this book attends not only to theoretical and empirical examinations but also to methodological and philosophical considerations at the intersection of sound and education gershon theoretically advances the rapidly expanding field of sound studies and simultaneously deepens conceptualizations and educational understandings across the fields of curriculum studies and foundations of education a feature of this work is the novel use of audio files aligned with the arguments within the book as well as the discussion and application of cutting edge qualitative research methods

an expanded skill set careful preparation and genuine courage drawing on author jo mcginley s more than thirty years of experience onstage and in the classroom going long provides a clear and practical framework for both beginning and experienced improvisers it includes mental exercises specifically developed for long form work best practices for rehearsals and collaboration techniques for connecting with the audience tips on crafting stories within specific genres and principles for making in the moment decisions that support an overarching narrative

the rich programme of icids 2009 comprising invited talks technical presentations and posters demonstrations and co located post conference workshops clearly underscores the event s status as premier international meeting in the domain it thereby confirms the decision taken by the constituting committee of the conference series to take the step forward out of the national cocoons of its precursors icvs and tidse and towards an itinerant platform reflecting its global constituency this move reflects the desire and the will to take on the challenge to stay on the lookout critically reflect upon and integrate views and findings and experiences and to promote interdisciplinary exchange while ensuring overall coherence and maintaining a sense of direction this is a significant enterprise the challenges sought are multifarious and must be addressed consistently at all levels the desire to involve all research communities and stakeholders must be matched by acknowledging the differences in established practises and by providing suitable means of guidance and introduction exposition and direct interaction at the event itself and of lasting and increasingly living documentation of which the present proceedings are but an important part
